The Irish Association of Social Workers (IASW) and British Association of Social Workers (BASW) Northern Ireland came together in Dundalk recently to host the first conference of its kind for social work. The event which sold out quickly was a unique opportunity to explore and understand the complexities of domestic abuse from an allisland viewpoint and was a very important networking opportunity.





All Island Community Safety Network. Minister for Justice Helen McEntee TD recently launched the new All Island Community Safety Network. Their first event, focusing on policy and practice relating to Domestic, Sexual and Gender Based Violence was hosted by Drogheda Implementation Board on March 12th and the RiVeR Project was delighted to support it. Policy makers and practitioners from across Ireland were in attendance. The project is being funded through the Community Safety Innovation Fund, which seeks to reinvest seized proceeds of crime directly back into projects to improve community safety.
